These lunchboxes contain foods with high levels of fat, sugar and salt. We are a healthy school and actively promote healthy eating. Unhealthy food choices especially at lunch time not only affects health but can also impact on behaviour. This in turn will impact on children's learning. School cooked lunches are carefully planned to ensure meals are well balanced, nutritional and healthy they are free to all children from Reception to Year 2.

However, if you do choose to provide a packed lunch then it must **NOT** contain fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate bars including chocolate spread sandwiches. They are not permitted in school and will be sent back home in lunchboxes. No nut products are permitted in school due to allergies. We have also noticed that some children are bringing excessive amounts of food in their packed lunches please make sure portion sizes are appropriate all children have fruit at morning break.




## Paediatric First Aid Qualification for Parents

### Youtube Risks - Uploading Video

Many children spend a lot of time watching vloggers (Video Log) such as Zoella. (Zoella can have over 3 million hits on her uploads!)



Some children chose to emulate these Vloggers, and in doing so

without careful thought can leave themselves open to bullying or online grooming by revealing personal details and making videos and comments available to anyone.

This is not illegal but the minimum age to create a Youtube account is 13. Having an account for a younger child breaks the terms and conditions of the site. It is not possible to upload videos without creating an account.
