Y2 Swimming

This year we have extended our PE provision to include swimming for KS1 children. Y2 children will have the opportunity to go swimming every week at the newly built Leisure Centre in Consett. These sessions will begin immediately after the half term holiday on Monday 2nd November .They will be swimming every Monday afternoon for the half term leading up to the Christmas . Children will need suitable swimwear and a towel in a named bag. Please also ensure that they have a warm outdoor coat, as they will feel the cold when leaving the baths.

Ron Hogg, Durham's Police and Crime Commissioner is hosting a free community event on Saturday 31st October 2015 at Sedgefield Racecourse and is encouraging young people and their families to attend and get involved.

Open from 10.00am to 3.00pm, the event is FREE to attend, with free parking and free attractions and activities too.

The event will raise awareness of all the good work that is happening in our local communities, to enable local people to find out more about the work of our real-life superheroes. Emergency services, including the police, fire service, mountain rescue and coastguard are attending. Children's activities, such as face-painting, a bouncy castle, and fancy dress competition (either Halloween or as their favourite superhero) are all free as well!

As well as the fun element of the event, parents will have access to information such as community safety advice, and the support services available to them, particularly for victims of crime.
