Winter Update

As winter is most definitely here with our first sight of snow on the ground, please remember to send children into school with wellies for outdoors (clearly labelled) and school shoes to wear inside. A spare pair of tights/socks and a pair of tracksuit bottoms in the children's PE kit would be greatly appreciated just in case we accidently get wet feet or trousers. We do try to enjoy playtimes as much as possible in all weather, especially the snow! We can only do this if children are suitably dressed and wearing appropriate footwear.

We do have a limited number of spare wellies and waterproof trousers/coats but if you have any old wellies that no longer fit your child we would welcome any donations to our spare welly box. We also have very few spare clothes in school at the moment so if you have any trousers skirts tights, or socks that no longer fit your child we would once again welcome any donations. Finally a quick reminder that if you have any school spare clothes at home we would be grateful if they could be returned as soon as possible.



Severe Weather Disruption

Well done to all those of you who braved the snowy weather today in order to get in to school this morning. A number of parents asked about closure procedures. In taking the decision to close a school, the safety of pupils, staff and visitors is of paramount importance. Making a decision to close is not something that is ever taken lightly and we will endeavour to remain open providing it is safe to do so. Over the winter period there may be times where we must make adjustments to the school day in order to ensure the safety of all. This may include cancelling breakfast club to give pupils and staff sufficient time to travel in the morning and ensure sufficient adults are on site.

In times of snowy weather we do understand that you may not make it into school on time and you must travel when it is safe to do. In these circumstances we will keep the register open longer than usual as we would prefer to see children arrive safely, slightly later than usual, than not at all. Should it be necessary to close fully, then wherever possible, we will try to ensure the decision to close is made early enough to help avoid unnecessary journeys and provide parents/carers with enough time to arrange childcare.

However, there are very occasionally unexpected events that come along requiring instant decisions to be made based upon site specific risk

assessments which could mean closing all or part of the school if it is determined to be no longer safe for pupils or staff.

We will always text priority contact numbers to advise if school is closed, therefore, please ensure all contact numbers are up to date.



Parking

Safeguarding our children is a priority and we ask that you have due respect for our neighbours and all children's safety when parking outside the school sites . It is an offence to park on the yellow zigzag lines outside the schools from 8am to 6pm. Please be aware that registrations numbers will be taken and passed on to the relevant authorities which may incur a fine.
