#### Nepal

He even got the chance to see Mount Everest. It was really interesting to hear about schools in another country and culture. We look forward to welcoming the headteacher of Golden Peak School in June and showing off our school to him.





#### Winter Bug

Over the past two weeks, a number of schools in the area have had to close due to an outbreak of Norovirus. The Norovirus, also called the "winter vomiting bug", is a stomach bug that causes vomiting and diarrhoea. It can be very unpleasant, but usually goes away in about 2 days. We have not had many instances and would like to remind parents and carers if your child is showing any signs of having Norovirus not to send them into school.

The main symptoms of norovirus are feeling sick (nausea), diarrhoea, being sick (vomiting). You may also have a high temperature of 38C or above, headache and aching arms and legs

The symptoms start suddenly within 1 to 2 days of being infected. The recommended absence from school is 48 hours after the last time your child were sick.

The spread of most infectious illnesses is reduced through good hand hygiene. Please encourage your child wash your hands frequently with warm water and soap, particularly after using the toilet, after using a tissue to catch a cough or sneeze, and before eating.

#### Feeding Families

Christmas is truly a magical time of year but we understand that it is also an expensive time of the year. Which is why we would like to bring to your attention Feeding Families (https://feedingfamilies.org.uk/) which is about bringing communities together. In these challenging times when families struggle to make ends meet, they link donors to families who need help and everyone gains! Feeding families aim to help those most in need of help and support at what can be a difficult and expensive time of year. Volunteers help to spread some Christmas cheer by providing families who need a little help with a food hamper. They accept requests for hampers from anyone who is in genuine need (subject to meeting criteria), and match them up with kind hearted person who will donate a Christmas Hamper full of everything to make a special Christmas dinner. It's just one less thing for the recipient to have to worry about.

To apply you will need to prove you are currently in receipt of a means tested benefit or can provide proof of low income if you are in work. Most of the applicants will qualify by being in receipt of a means tested benefit. They will need to prove this, along with evidence of the size of their family and proof of their address. The deadline is the 30th November (this Saturday) so if you wish to apply please do so quickly. Alternatively, you may wish to register to donate a hamper to a family less fortunate and in need of little help this Christmas.
