COVID UPDATE

Dear Parent /Carer,

Many of you may be aware that we, like all schools in County Durham, have received a letter from Durham County Council requesting us to review Additional control measures to manage COVID-19 transmission in education settings.

Currently we have had only 1 positive case (0.4% of the school community) within the last 19 days and continue to use a range of strategies and control measures to reduce contact and transmission of COVID19 within the school setting.

The additional recommendations suggested include : Reintroducing Staggering start and finish times, Reduce mixing between year groups and classes as far as possible, Schools to carefully consider whether educational visits should go ahead, Schools carefully consider whether open days, events and meetings and could move to a virtual format.

Given that we continue to follow COVID measures include soft bubbles, separate lunches on both sites, hand hygiene, limited visitors and no gatherings/assemblies on site, increased ventilation etc myself, Chair and Vice Chair of the school governing body have decided that introducing any further restrictions on staff and children at this time would not be proportionate to our current position and could be detrimental to the other benefits gained from allowing children at such a young age to socialise and continue as far as normal as possible. We will continue to review the situation and may reintroduce some or all of these measures should they become necessary.

Our priority remains, to maximise the number of children in face-to-face education and minimise any disruption to their education. A huge thank you to every family that continues to support us through PCR testing to ensure we remove every case from the school setting as soon as possible. We would ask that from next week you follow these 2 recommendations :

- PCR testing for all adults and pupils if they are a close contact of a positive case in their household*.
- Daily LFT testing for 7 days at home for any adult or secondary age pupil or primary key stage 2 pupil who is a household contact of a positive case and is exempt from isolation and continues to attend school. Testing should start from the day the household member has symptoms or if they don't have symptoms from when they tested positive*.

*Note: People who have tested positive with a PCR test within the last 90 days should not be encouraged to test unless they develop new symptoms

We will continuing to monitor the COVID-19 case rate and the impact on our school very closely. We will review our recommendations if the position changes and inform you as soon as there are any changes to our recommendations.
