Children Showing COVID19 Symptoms

Can I remind all parents that if your child is showing ANY COVID19 Symptoms or is sent home showing symptoms, they must take a PCR test before returning to school. Keeping cases out of school not only protects everyone but also reduces the need to return to bubbles, class closures and remote learning.

If anyone in the house tests positive – please ensure all members of the household take a PCR test and then follow up with LFT testing every day for 7 days as advised by Public Health

Key Symptoms Main symptoms of coronavirus are: • a high temperature • a new, continuous cough – coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours • a loss or change to sense of smell or taste • Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms. • Some people have no symptoms (asymptomatic)

If any doubt please keep your child off school and help us to protect Christmas for everyone
