## Current COVID Update

We currently have 6 reported positive cases of COVID 19 within the school community and a further 3 suspected cases awaiting confirmation. #### **County Durham School Benevolent Fund**

Dear parent / Carer,

Please note **County Durham School Benevolent Fund** is no longer accepting applications for school shoes and winter coats with effect from Monday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2022.

County Durham will be signposting families who are in receipt of child benefit and require help with buying items for school to apply for a <u>NE First Credit Union Family Loans</u>. The Credit Union could provide a loan of up to £500 without having a credit check - this will be conditional upon an affordability check and child benefit being paid directly from the DWP to the Credit Union.

A Family Loan provides access to a cash loan up front to purchase the required items and also the option of saving something each month for the future.

All previously confirmed Benevolent Fund applications will still be valid and families have 6 months (from the confirmation date) to return receipts to school for a refund.
