This week both sites enjoyed a wonderful Vocal Music Concert from Durham Music Service which left many singing the rest of the day. All the children, especially the youngest, were praised for their excellent behaviour and concentration.

National Bug Busting Day

National Bug busting day was this week on June 15th.

This day is about encouraging families to check their kids for nits on National Bug Busting Day — on January 31, June 15, and October 31 — helps reduce the incidence of lice and their potential to spread via classrooms. Head lice can affect anyone at any age, but these pesky creatures most frequently prey on children between 4 and 11. Although they're not particularly dangerous, they certainly cause a lot of irritation and distress. Because you can't easily spot head-lice eggs, combing wet hair with a special comb lets you catch nits early and remove them before they hatch and make their way to other people. This method avoids harsh insecticides and can help prevent outbreaks in schools.

Please continue to check as children spend more time outside in close contact.

Grab a Jab for 5-11-year-olds and 12-17-year-olds in COUNTY HALL, DURHAM

Sunday 12th June, Sunday 19th June and Sunday 26th June

10am – 1pm - 1st & 2nd doses 5-11year olds 2pm – 6pm – 1st & 2nd doses 12–17-year-olds

County Hall, Durham, DH1 5UJ

No appointment needed – Just walk in! Children must be accompanied by an adult with parental responsibility

Jabs available for:

- 1st & 2nd doses Age 5-11
- Minimum 12 weeks between 1st & 2nd doses
- If your child has a condition that means they're at high risk from COVID-19 or they live with someone who has a weakened immune system, they can get a 2nd dose from 8 weeks after their 1st dose.
- 1st & 2nd doses age 12+
- Minimum 12 weeks between 1st & 2nd doses for age 12-17

Tested positive COVID-19?

You need to wait before getting any dose of the vaccine.

- **Wait 12 weeks (84 days)** if you're aged 5-17 years old
- Wait 4 weeks (28 days) if you're aged 5-17 years old and at high risk from COVID-19 or live with someone who has a weakened immune system.
