

Black History Month

Black history month is celebrated through the whole of October. In addition, this year each class will be learning about a significant figure in Black History who fought for positive change.

In Early Years we will be reading a range of diverse stories and exploring music / food / clothing from cultures of famous black figures and celebrities.

In Year we will be learning about Rosa Parks, she was called "**the mother of the civil rights movement**," Rosa Parks invigorated the struggle for racial equality when she refused to give up her bus seat to a white man in Montgomery, Alabama.

In Year 2 we will learn about Mary Seascole, as a mixed-race woman living in the 19th century, what Mary Seacole achieved in her lifetime was truly remarkable. She **broke social rules and prejudices to travel the world, run businesses and help those in need** – even in the most dangerous places.

In Year 3 we will learn about Florence Price, Florence published more than 300 compositions including music for piano and organ, popular songs, concertos for violin and piano, four symphonies, and many spirituals and vocal works. **Price was the first black woman composer to have a symphony performed by a major American orchestra**.

In Year 4 we will learn about Harriet Tubman, Known as the "Moses of her people," Harriet Tubman was **enslaved**, **escaped**, **and helped others gain their freedom as a "conductor" of the Underground Railroad**. Tubman also served as a scout, spy, guerrilla soldier, and nurse for the Union Army during the Civil War.

In Year 5 we will learn about Mae Jemison. As a **doctor, engineer, and NASA astronaut**, Mae Jemison has always reached for the stars. In 1992, Jemison became the first African American woman to travel in space. In Year 6 we will learn about the life of Martin Luther King Jr., he is **a civil rights legend**. In the mid-1950s, Dr. King led the movement to end segregation and counter prejudice in the United States through the means of peaceful protest. His speeches have become some of the most iconic of the 20th century.
