



Autumn Term

PSHE/RSE

We will explore and reflect on their strengths, skills, and interests, focusing on self-worth and resilience, setting goals, learning from mistakes, and reframing thoughts.



English

Pupils will enhance their reading and writing skills by exploring Michael Morpurgo's *Beowulf*. They will create imaginative fiction and informative non-fiction texts inspired by this classic tale, while also taking inspiration from real-life events to enrich their writing.

Maths

Pupils will deepen their understanding of place value with numbers up to 1000 and practise addition and subtraction using both mental strategies and formal written methods. They will also continue to develop their multiplication and division knowledge, learning and securing times tables up to 12×12 .



Science

We will explore digestion and teeth, studying the human digestive system, functions of organs, types of teeth, their roles, and how they aid healthy eating.



Religious Education

Children will explore what the Bible is, its key teachings, and why it is important to Christians, understanding its role in guiding Christian beliefs and their daily life.



History

Students will learn about what happened after the Romans left Britain. They will study when the Anglo-Saxons arrived, how they influenced life, and important parts of how they lived.

Computing

We will study networks, internet, and web, focusing on content ownership, safe use, and evaluating online information's reliability and trustworthiness.

French

Pupils will learn basic French greetings, class commands, numbers, days, months, and classroom-related vocabulary, including rooms and objects, building essential language skills for basic communication.



Music

Children will have the exciting opportunity this term to learn the recorder, taught by skilled professionals from Durham Music Service.

PE

Pupils will develop movement skills through Fundamentals and Fitness, building strength and coordination, while also learning Tennis skills and participating in Forest School.

DT

Children will explore Anglo-Saxon building structures, designing and creating their own replicas using various materials and techniques, then evaluate their work.
